Deciduous Fruit Trees

Almond

- **All-in-One (Semi-Dwarf)** - Medium to large fruit. Soft shelled with sweet good quality kernels. Its heavy production restricts growth so that some classify the tree as semi-dwarf to 15 ft. Self-fertile. #1 almond for home orchards. Chilling hours: 500, Ripens: Late September/Early October

Apple

- **Anna (Semi-Dwarf)** – Light greenish-yellow skin with slight red blush. Sweet, slightly tart, crisp, flavorful, creamy white flesh. Large fruit. Bears heavy crops. Good flavor fresh from the tree. Stores well. Produces at an early age. For better fruit production, and larger fruit size use a pollinizer, such as Dorsett Golden. Chilling hours: 200-300, Ripens: July
- **Dorsett Golden (a.k.a. Golden Dorsett) (Semi-Dwarf)** – Outstanding sweet apple for warm winter areas. Yellow skin with orange-red blush. Firm, smooth, crisp flesh with sweet-tart flavor. Very flavorful. Medium to large fruit. Does well in very mild winter areas. Good eating. It is a good pollinizer for Anna. Developed from Golden Delicious. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 100-250, Ripens: Mid June-Early July
- **Fuji (Semi-Dwarf)** – Reddish-green skin. Firm, very crisp, juicy, white flesh with excellent flavor. Medium fruit. A favorite eating apple. Excellent pollinizer for other apples. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 350-400, Ripens: September
- **3-in-1 Espaliered Combo** – Anna x Dorsett Golden x Fuji -3 apple varieties grafted onto one tree and placed on 4 x 4 espalier trellis.
- **4-in-1 Combo (See Specialty Combos)**

Apricot

- **Blenheim (Royal) (Semi-Dwarf)** – Medium to large, oval fruit. Yellow skin with orange cheeks. Freestone, sweet, aromatic, and flavorful apricot. No. 1 apricot in California. Great fresh, canned, and dried. Early bloomer. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 400-500, Ripens: Late June
- **Gold Kist (Semi-Dwarf)** – Very heavy producer. Excellent sweet, tart flavor. Very good eating. Freestone. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 300, Ripens: Mid May

Aprium (Apricot-Plum hybrid)

- **Cot-N-Candy (Semi-Dwarf)** – Extra sweet white flesh. Very juicy with a plummy aftertaste. Fruit size is about 2-2 ½” on average. Self-fruitful. Chilling hours: 600, Ripens: Mid June
- **Flavor Delight (Semi-Dwarf)** – Sweet, bright yellow fruit. Resembles an apricot but with a distinctive flavor and texture all of its own. 2” in diameter. Bigger crops if pollinated by another apricot. Chilling hours: 600, Ripens: Early June

Cherry

- **Minnie Royal (Standard)** - Medium-sized red cherry. Firm with good flavor. Mainly used as a pollinizer for Royal Lee. Chilling hours: 400-500, Ripens: Early May
- **Royal Lee (Standard)** - Medium to large sized red cherry. Heart shaped. Very firm with excellent flavor. Pollinated by Minnie Royal. Chilling hours: 400-500, Ripens: Late May

Jujube - Shiny, reddish-brown, date like fruit. Sweet, apple flavor. Needs hot summers for fruit to ripen. It has an attractive silhouette producing clusters of yellow flowers. Nice decorative tree. A small tree can grow up to 10-15 ft. tall in about 15 years. Chilling hours: 100. Ripens: Fall

- **Contorted (Standard)** – Round-shaped. Reddish-brown when ripe, eaten firm and crunchy or room-dried to date-like chewy sweetness. Partly self-fruitful or pollinated by Lang. Branching structure is twisted and contorted.
- **Lang (Standard)** – Pear shaped, 1 ½ inches long fruit. Ripens later than Li. Better to fully ripen on tree to full mahogany color for best flavor. A more upright grower than Li.
- **Li (Standard)** – Round plump, 1 1/2" long. Shiny, reddish-brown, date-like fruit. Sweet apple flavor. Ripens earlier than Lang. It can be picked yellow-green & will finish ripening off the tree. Needs hot summer for fruit to ripen. Partly self-fertile, or pollinated by Lang.
- **Sherwood (Standard)** - Large shiny reddish brown date-like fruit. Sweet apple-like flavor. Trees may have fewer thorns than other Jujubes.

Mulberry

- **Persian Fruiting (Morus nigra) (Standard)** – Densely foliated tree to 25-30 ft. Large heart-shaped leaves. Fruit resembles blackberry. Juicy, dark red to black fruit, good for jam.

Nectaplum (Nectarine-Plum hybrid)

- **Spicezee (Semi-Dwarf)** - Combination of nectarine and plum. Slightly acidic and loaded with sugar to create a spicy sweet flavor. Also is a beautiful ornamental tree with dark red leaves in spring and tremendous blooms. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 500, Ripens: July/August

Nectarine All are self-fertile.

- **Desert Delight (Semi-Dwarf)** – Large fruit with bright red skin and yellow flesh. Delicious, rich, nectarine flavor. Chilling hours: 200 hours, Ripens: Mid June
- **Panamint (Semi-Dwarf)** – Rich red skin. Juicy, golden-yellow flesh. Aromatic & intensely flavored. Medium to large fruit. Freestone. Vigorous and productive. Chilling hours: 250-300, Ripens: Late July
- **Snow Queen (Semi-Dwarf)** – Sweet, juicy, white, medium to large-sized fruit. Ripens 2-3 weeks ahead of Babcock peach. Freestone. Chilling hours: 250-300 hours, Ripens: Late June
- **Dwarf Necta-Zee** – Sweet, yellow, freestone nectarine with red skin. Can grow to 6 ft. tall. Perfect for large containers, or areas with minimal yard space. Chilling hours: 500, Ripens: Early July
- **Dwarf Southernbelle** – Yellow skin with red blush and yellow flesh. Very large fruit. Very productive. Freestone. The tree height is 5 ft. tall. Chilling hours: 300, Ripens: Early August

Peach - All are self-fertile

- **August Pride (Semi-Dwarf)** – Large fruit with yellow skin and flesh. Sweet, aromatic, rich flavor. Freestone. Chilling hours: 275, Ripens: August
- **May Pride (Semi-Dwarf)** – Delicious, sweet, tangy flavor. Very large fruit. Large, showy pink blossoms. Very early ripening peach. Chilling hours: 175 – 200, Ripens: Late May- Early June
- **Giant Babcock (Semi-Dwarf)** – Red skin. White flesh with streaks of red. Sweet, aromatic and juicy. Very large fruit. Freestone. Very productive. Chilling hours: 500, Ripens: July
- **Red Baron (Semi-Dwarf)** – Yellow skin and yellow flesh. Sweet and juicy flavor. Large fruit. Freestone. Large beautiful, double red blossoms cover the tree for several weeks in early spring. Chilling hours: 250-300, Ripens: Mid July-Early August
- **Stark Saturn (Donut) (Semi-Dwarf)** – Chinese white-fleshed fruit resembles doughnut. Sweet, mild flavor, described by some as almond-like. Juicy, with a small pit. Chilling hours: 400-500, Ripens: Late June/Early July
- **Dwarf Honey Babe** – Yellow flesh, with deep red skin. Freestone. Grows to about 4-6 feet high. Can be clipped to shape. Chilling hours: 500, Ripens: Mid July
- **Dwarf Southern Flame** – Yellow skin with red blush. Firm, crisp, melting, yellow flesh. Good eating quality and aroma. Large fruit. Freestone. The tree height is 5 ft. tall. Chilling hours: 400, Ripens: Late July
- **5-in-1 Combo (See Specialty Combos)**

Asian Pear

- **Hosui (Standard)** – Brownish-orange russet skin. Juicy, sweet, flavorful, fine textured flesh. Crisp and refreshing like an apple. Medium to large fruit. Requires a pollinizer, such as 20th Century. Chilling hours: 450, Ripens: August
- **20th Century (Standard)** – Thin, yellow-green skin. Firm, juicy, cream-white flesh. Good for fresh eating and canning. Crisp and refreshing like an apple. Medium, round fruit. Heavy bearing. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 400, Ripens: Late July to Mid August
- **4-in-1 Combo (See Specialty Combos)**

Pecan

- **Western Schley (Standard)** – Soft shell. Rich flavored nut. Heavy producer at an early age. Large tree. Excellent for Southern California deserts and higher altitudes. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 200, Ripens: Early to Mid October

Persimmon –All are self-fertile

- **Coffecake™ (Standard)** – Flat-shape with orange skin and orange flesh flecked with brown. Unique spicy-sweet flavor. Flat-shaped and non-astringent. Chilling hours: 200, Ripens: Mid September-Mid October.
- **Fuyu Jiro (Standard)** – Reddish orange skin. Medium, flattened fruit. Good eating. Heavy producer. Still hard when ripe. Non-astringent. Chilling hours: 200, Ripens: November
- **Giant Fuyu (Standard)** – Dark orange skin. Sweet and flavorful. Smooth texture. Very large, round to semi oblong fruit. Firm when ripe but softens quickly. Non-astringent. Chilling hours: 200, Ripens: November
- **Hachiya (Standard)** – Bright orange-red skin, covered with dark blotches. Sweet, rich excellent quality. Very large fruit. Oblong with a short point. Largest and best cooking quality. Astringent until soft ripe. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 200, Ripens: November

Plum

- **Burgundy (Semi-Dwarf)** – Maroon-colored skin and flesh. Sweet flavor with little or no tartness. Small pit. Very productive. Red Japanese plum. Narrow, upright habit. Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 400, Ripens: Late July-Early August

- **Green Gage** (*Semi Dwarf*) – Round, medium, yellow green fruit. Firm, greenish-yellow flesh. Sweet, aromatic and a bit tart. **Chilling hours: 400, Ripens: Mid July**
- **Santa Rosa** (*Semi-Dwarf*) –Purplish-red skin. Firm flesh, yellow to dark red near skin. Large, oval fruit. Rich, tart flavor. **Self-fertile. Chilling hours: 400, Ripens: Mid June**
- **4-in-1 Combo** (*See Specialty Combos*)

Pluot (Plum-Apricot hybrid)

- **Flavor Grenade** (*Semi-Dwarf*) – Elongated green fruit with a red blush. Crisp texture and explosive flavor. Taste test winner. Hangs on the tree for 4-6 weeks. **Requires a pollinizer like Santa Rosa. Chilling hours: 500-600, Ripens: August**
- **Flavor King** (*Semi-Dwarf*) – Reddish-purple skin. Sweet red flesh. Taste test winner. Remarkable, spicy bouquet and flavor. Naturally small tree. **Requires a pollinizer like Santa Rosa. Chilling hours: 400-500, Ripens: Mid August**
- **4-in-1 Combo** (*See Specialty Combos*)

Pomegranate

- **Angel Red** – Heavy yielding fruit. Bright red fruit. Extremely sweet and high juice content. Excellent for fresh eating with edible seeds that are soft enough to eat with the pulp. Also excellent for juicing. Uniform size & color. Ripens earlier than Wonderful. **Chilling hours: 150-200, Ripens: August**
- **Eversweet** – Very sweet, red-skinned, nearly skinless. The clear juice does not stain. Showy orange flowers. 8-10' arching shrub. **Chilling hours: 150, Ripens: Early September-Mid October**
- **Grenada** – Large fruit. Resembles Wonderful with deeper red blossoms. Bears fruit regularly. Fruit is darker in color and less tart than Wonderful. Ripens well in coastal & inland areas. **Chilling hours: 150-200, Ripens: August**
- **Parfianka** – Medium-sized fruit. Naturally dwarf in habit, bushes set profuse amounts of fruit even when young. Soft seeds and a flavorful, sweet tart taste. Rated among the best in taste tests. Excellent for juicing. **Chilling hours: 150-200, Ripens: Early to mid fall**

Pomegranate Tree (Single trunk)

- **Wonderful** - Extra large fruit. Blushed red skin. Red flesh. Juicy w/ a sharp flavor. Shrub or tree to 20 ft. tall. **Chilling hours 150, Ripens: September**

Ume (Flowering Apricot)

- **Koume** – Semi-double pink flowers have a spicy fragrance. Blooms from late January to early February. Small fruit, usually ¾" to 1" diameter. Used for pickling (umeboshi) or medicinal purposes. **Good pollinizer for Shiro-Kaga. Chilling hours: 400, Ripens: Mid May**
- **Shiro-Kaga** – Single white flowers have a spicy fragrance. Blooms from late January to early February. Small fruit, usually ¾" to 1" diameter. Used for pickling (umeboshi) or medicinal purposes. **Needs pollinizer such as Koume. Chilling hours 400, Ripens: Mid May**

Specialty Combos

These trees are for mild climate areas like ours. Enjoy different flavors all on one tree. Get longer fruit production. Space saver.

CHILLING HOURS refers to the number of hours, 45°F and under, during the dormancy period. These hours are cumulative and need not be continuous. All fruit and nut trees need a specific amount of chilling hours before they will produce fruit.

Berries, Grapes, & Vegetables

Artichoke

- **Improved Green Globe** - Productive. Good flavor. Plant in fertile, well-drained soil. Protect from frost. Perennial. Full sun. Average watering. **Harvest: Summer**

Asparagus

- **U.C. 72** - Large, uniform stalks. High production, disease tolerant. Rust resistant & somewhat drought tolerant. Plant in fertile, well-drained soil. Full sun. **Harvest: Late Spring-Early Summer.**

Blackberry

- **Black Satin**- Thornless. Medium to large black berries. Honey sweet flavor. Semi-erect habit. Very disease resistant. Plant 2-4' apart in 6-9' rows. Needs well-drained soil. Full sun. **Harvest: Summer**

Blueberry

—all blueberries require acidic, well-drained, humus rich soil.

- **Misty** - Sky blue, medium large fruit. Pink & white bell-shaped flowers. 5' x 5'. Good for large tubs. Self pollinating, but yields more when planted with other varieties. Needs acidic, well-drained soil. Full sun. **Chilling hours 300, Ripens: Midsummer-Fall**
- **O'Neal** - Large, firm fruit. Sweet & flavorful. 5-6' tall. Upright habit. Self-fertile, but yields more with other varieties. Needs acidic, well-drained soil. Full sun. Low chill, tolerates heat. **Chilling hours 200, Ripens: Early Summer**
- **Sunshine Blue** - Small berries with a good tangy flavor producing over an extended period. It easily overbears & should be heavily pruned & thinned or fruit will be very small. 3' tall. Showy pink flowers. Tolerates higher pH better than many other varieties. **Chilling hours 150, Ripens: May-June**
- **South Moon** – Very large fruit with outstanding flavor. Vigorous, upright habit. Can grow to 6' tall. Needs acidic, well-drained soil. Full sun. **Chilling hours 500, Ripens: Early May**

Boysenberry

- **Thornless** – Large, non-shiny, reddish-black colored berry. Soft, very juicy, sweet-tart flavor. Dark green foliage, dusty bloom with no thorns. Good for canning, freezing, fresh-eating, jelly, and syrup. **Ripens: June**

Grapes (Table)

- **Canadice Seedless** – Red seedless grape. Very productive. Sweet, fruity, excellent flavor. Cane pruning. **Ripens: Mid-August**
- **Concord 'Eastern'** – Blue-black, thick, tough skin grape. Excellent, strong flavor. Good for juice, jelly, and table use. Cane pruning. **Ripens: August-September**
- **Fantasy Seedless** - Blue-black skin with pale green flesh. Thin-skinned and firm. Large, seedless fruit. Excellent sweet flavor. Stores well. Cane pruning. **Ripens: Early August**
- **Golden Muscat** - Golden-green skin. Large, seeded fruit. Sweet flavor. Table and wine grape. Cane pruning. **Ripens: August**
- **Interlaken Seedless** – Hybrid of Thompson seedless & American. Pale green, sweet, crisp berry. Cane pruning. Early harvest.
- **Thompson Seedless** - Greenish-white to golden skin. Medium, seedless fruit. Sweet flavor. Table and wine grape. Cane pruning. **Ripens: Early August**

Grapes (Wine)

- **Cabernet Sauvignon** – Late season red wine grape. Small, black, strongly flavored berry. Vigorous vine. Self-fruitful. Cane pruning. **Ripens: Late September to October**
 - **Chardonnay** - For white burgundy wines. Small round berry. Best quality where summers are cool. Vigorous vine. Self-fruitful. Cane pruning. **Ripens: Late August to September**
 - **Merlot** – Medium sized, round, bluish-black fruits. Used for distinctive red wines. Ages quicker than Cabernet Sauvignon. Spur or cane pruning. **Ripens: Late September to October**
 - **Pinot Noir** – Small black berries that yield the famous French Burgundy wines. Requires cool summers. Cane pruning. Early harvest.
 - **Zinfandel** – For fruity red wines. Medium size, round, juicy, reddish-black berry. Spur pruning. **Ripens: August**
1. Cane Pruning-Varieties which develop fruiting wood away from the base of the cane, leaving long canes to train on wires or trellis. Tend to be excellent for arbors.
 2. Spur Pruning-Varieties which develop fruiting wood close to the base of canes-prune back to within several buds to leave small spurs for development of new wood. Used mostly for wine grapes and a few table grapes.

Raspberry

- **Fall Gold** - Yellow-gold fruit. Extremely sweet and excellent for fresh eating, canning, and preserves. Similar to red raspberries except in color. Growth habit is similar to Heritage. Everbearing. Vigorous canes. 5 - 6' long. Needs well-drained, slightly acid soil. In heavy clay soils plant in raised beds. Full sun. **Harvest: June-October**
- **Heritage** - Large red fruit. Very firm. Excellent quality. Everbearing. Vigorous canes. 5 - 6' long. Needs well-drained, slightly acid soil. In heavy clay soils plant in raised beds. Full sun. **Harvest: June-August**

Strawberry

- **Seascape** – Sweet, high yielding, everbearing strawberry. Bright red fruit are firm, conical-shaped, and have an attractive glossy finish.
